## **Alabama House Passes Resolution Urging Congress to End the Abuse of Tort Law against the Firearms Industry**

*Rep. Albritton, Rep. Beason, Rep. Gaines, Rep. Humphryes, Rep. Collier, and Rep. Glover call for congressional action.*

WASHINGTON- **The Alabama House passed a resolution calling on Congress to end the abuse of tort laws against the firearms industry.** Today, Americans for Tax Reform (ATR), the nation's leading taxpayer advocacy group, praised Alabama Representatives Greg Albritton (R-64), Scott Beason (R-51), Mark Gaines (R-46), Bobby Humphryes (R-15), Spencer Collier (R-105), and Rusty Glover (R-102) for their aggressiveness supporting tort reform against the firearms industry.

ATR's State Legislative Advisory Project was launched in 2001 in an effort to help give state legislators a louder voice in federal policymaking. In the project's first year, twenty-seven states passed resolutions urging their congressional delegations to support the Economic Growth Tax Relief Reconciliation Act. As of June, 2004, state legislators have already introduced 159 different resolutions in 40 legislative bodies in 25 states and passed 64 different resolutions in 23 legislative bodies in 16 states.

**"Ending the abuse of tort law against the firearms industry is a priority for any American concerned about liberty and freedom from a government too ready to impose more restraints on law-abiding citizens,"** said taxpayer advocate Grover Norquist, president of ATR. **"Anti-gun activists are using taxpayers' money to sue the gun industry in an under-handed attempt to bankrupt a lawful industry."**

This resolution reminds Alabama's congressional delegates that the firearms manufacturers should not be liable for any harm caused by misuse or by unlawful use of products that function as designed and intended.

Norquist praised the efforts of the sponsors. **"State legislators are intimately involved with their districts and their constituents. They should not shy away from offering valuable insight into the federal lawmaking process."**
