Fern Shubert Signs No-New-Taxes Pledge

Gubernatorial Candidate in North Carolina Promises to Oppose Tax Increases

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Americans for Tax Reform applauds the pro-taxpayer platform of Fern Shubert, who is running for the Republican nomination for governor in North Carolina.

Sen. Shubert demonstrated her dedication to the taxpayers of North Carolina by signing the Taxpayer Protection Pledge on July 15, 2004. By signing the pledge, Shubert promises “to oppose and veto any and all efforts to increase taxes.”

Sen. Shubert’s opponents in the Republican primary, Richard Vinroot, Patrick Ballantine, George Little, and Bill Cobey have also signed the Pledge. Davie County Commissioner Dan Barrett has so far refused to sign.

As of today’s date, eight governors and over 1280 state legislators, as well as four lieutenant governors, two attorneys general, four secretaries of state, four state treasurers, 217 U.S. representatives, 42 U.S. senators, and President George W. Bush have signed the Taxpayer Protection Pledge.

“Fern Shubert joins numerous lawmakers and candidates at the state and federal levels who have committed themselves to principles of limited government,” commented Grover Norquist, President of ATR.

“I applaud Sen. Shubert for her commitment to all taxpayers of North Carolina. I urge all the other candidates for governor to sign the Pledge, in the hopes that more elected officials will dedicate themselves to taxpayers, rather than tax-and-spending.”
