## Leo P. Pepino Signs ATR Pledge

-- Representative Leo P. Pepino of New Hampshire Promises to Oppose  
Tax Increases --

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Americans for Tax Reform applauds the pro-taxpayer platform of Representative Leo P. Pepino. He represents the voters of the 51<sup>st</sup> House district in New Hampshire.

Representative Pepino confirmed his dedication to the taxpayers of New Hampshire by re-signing the Taxpayer Protection Pledge, which he signed twice in the past, on January 1, 2004. By signing the pledge, Pepino promises “to oppose and vote against any and all efforts to increase taxes.”

As of today’s date, over 1200 state legislators have signed the Pledge. Nine governors, four lieutenant governors, two attorneys general, four secretaries of state, four treasurers, 217 U.S. representatives, 42 U.S. senators, and President George W. Bush have signed similar versions of the Taxpayer Protection Pledge.

“Leo P. Pepino is one of numerous lawmakers and candidates at the state and federal levels who have committed themselves to principles of limited government,” commented Grover Norquist, President of ATR.

“I applaud Rep. Pepino for his commitment to the taxpayers of the 51<sup>st</sup> House district and all of the taxpayers of New Hampshire. I extend the invitation to sign the pledge to every incumbent and candidate running for office, in the hopes that more elected officials will dedicate themselves to taxpayers, rather than tax-and-spending.”
