Peter “Pedro” De Baets Signs ATR Pledge

-- Candidate for California Assembly Promises to Oppose Tax Increases --

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Americans for Tax Reform applauds the pro-taxpayer platform of candidate Peter “Pedro” De Baets. He is running for the 47th Assembly seat in California.

Mr. De Baets demonstrated his dedication to the taxpayers of California by signing the Taxpayer Protection Pledge on February 17, 2004. By signing the pledge, he promises “to oppose and vote against any and all efforts to increase taxes.”

As of today’s date, over 1220 state legislators have signed the Pledge. Nine governors, four lieutenant governors, two attorneys general, four secretaries of state, four treasurers, 217 U.S. representatives, 42 U.S. senators, and President George W. Bush have signed similar versions of the Taxpayer Protection Pledge.

“Pedro De Baets joins numerous lawmakers and candidates at the state and federal levels who have committed themselves to principles of limited government,” commented Grover Norquist, President of ATR.

“I applaud Mr. De Baets for his commitment to the taxpayers of the 47th Assembly district and all of the taxpayers of California. I extend the invitation to sign the pledge to every candidate running for office, in the hopes that more elected officials will dedicate themselves to taxpayers, rather than to taxing-and-spending.”
