George Runner Signs ATR Pledge

-- Candidate for California Senate Promises to Oppose Tax Increases --

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Americans for Tax Reform applauds the pro-taxpayer platform of candidate George Runner. He is running for the 17th Senate seat in California.

Mr. Runner demonstrated his dedication to the taxpayers of California by signing the Taxpayer Protection Pledge on February 26, 2004. By signing the pledge, he promises “to oppose and vote against any and all efforts to increase taxes.”

Mr. Runner previously served in the California Assembly, where he was also a Pledge signer.

As of today’s date, over 1220 state legislators have signed the Pledge. Nine governors, four lieutenant governors, two attorneys general, four secretaries of state, four treasurers, 217 U.S. representatives, 42 U.S. senators, and President George W. Bush have signed similar versions of the Taxpayer Protection Pledge.

“George Runner joins numerous lawmakers and candidates at the state and federal levels who have committed themselves to principles of limited government,” commented Grover Norquist, President of ATR.

“I applaud Mr. Runner for his commitment to the taxpayers of the 17th Senate district and all of the taxpayers of California. I extend the invitation to sign the pledge to every candidate running for office, in the hopes that more elected officials will dedicate themselves to taxpayers, rather than to taxing-and-spending.”
