# Eric Miller Signs No-New-Taxes Pledge

-- Gubernatorial Candidate in Indiana Promises to Oppose Tax Increases --

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Americans for Tax Reform applauds the pro-taxpayer platform of Eric I. Miller, who has embarked on the gubernatorial campaign trail in Indiana.

Mr. Miller demonstrated his dedication to the taxpayers of Indiana by signing the Taxpayer Protection Pledge on April 19, 2004. By signing the pledge, Miller promises “to oppose and veto any and all efforts to increase taxes.”

**Mr. Miller’s opponent in the Republican primary, former Bush Administration official Mitch Daniels, declined to sign the Pledge.**

As of today’s date, nine governors and over 1240 state legislators have signed the Pledge. Four lieutenant governors, two attorneys general, four secretaries of state, four treasurers, 216 U.S. representatives, 42 U.S. senators, and President George W. Bush have signed similar versions of the Taxpayer Protection Pledge.

**“Eric I. Miller joins numerous lawmakers and candidates at the state and federal levels who have committed themselves to principles of limited government,”** commented Grover Norquist, President of ATR.

**“I applaud Mr. Miller for his commitment to all taxpayers of Indiana. I extend the invitation to sign the pledge to every candidate running for office, in the hopes that more elected officials will dedicate themselves to taxpayers, rather than tax-and-spending.”**
