Christopher Oprison Signs No-New-Taxes Pledge

-- Candidate for Virginia House in '05 Pledges to Oppose Tax Increases --

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Americans for Tax Reform applauds the pro-taxpayer platform of candidate Christopher Oprison. He is running for the 33rd House seat in Virginia. The seat is currently held by tax hiker Joe T. May, who voted for the biggest tax increase in the history of the commonwealth.

Mr. Oprison demonstrated his dedication to the taxpayers of Virginia by signing the Taxpayer Protection Pledge on September 6, 2004. By signing the pledge, he promises “to oppose and vote against any and all efforts to increase taxes.”

As of today’s date, over 1300 state legislators have signed the Pledge. Eight governors, four lieutenant governors, two attorneys general, four secretaries of state, four treasurers, 217 U.S. representatives, 42 U.S. senators, and President George W. Bush have also signed the Pledge.

“The taxpayers of Virginia did not deserve the unnecessary tax hike, which Del. May supported. By signing the Pledge, Mr. Oprison has put his commitment not to raise taxes on Virginians in writing, and joins numerous lawmakers and candidates at the state and federal levels who have committed themselves to principles of limited government,” commented Grover Norquist, President of ATR.

“I applaud Mr. Oprison for his commitment to the taxpayers of the 33rd House district and all of the taxpayers of Virginia. I extend the invitation to sign the pledge to every candidate running for office, in the hopes that more elected officials will dedicate themselves to taxpayers, rather than tax-and-spending.”
