Happy 92nd! Ronald Reagan Turns 92 Years Old on February 6!

Across the country, Americans fondly remember their hero, as states proclaim "Ronald Reagan Day."

WASHINGTON- On Thursday February 6, America's 40th President, Ronald Wilson Reagan, will turn 92. The Ronald Reagan Legacy Project joins his countless admirers across the country, and around the world, in wishing him a happy and healthy birthday.

As part of its effort to keep Reagan's legacy alive, the RRLP has asked state governors and legislative bodies to honor the former president by declaring his birthday "Ronald Reagan Day" in their states.
