<b>16</b>	Number of days it took Obama to break his campaign promise to not raise taxes on any family earning more than \$250,000 per year (by signing a tobacco tax hike which affects people making \$36,000 on average)
<b>40%</b>	Tax rate Obama would like to take small business profit taxes to
<b>2/3</b>	The percentage of small business profits that will pay this tax rate
<b>43 million</b>	Number of Americans working in small businesses (<100 employees)
<b>36%</b>	Percentage of Americans working in small businesses (43 million)
<b>\$10,000</b>	Amount of higher energy taxes American families will have to pay every year if the Obama-Pelosi-Reid budget is enacted (including cap and tax)
<b>\$3100</b>	The average family's annual share of the "cap and tax" scheme
<b>60%</b>	The percentage of all income taxes currently being paid by the top 5% of families (must earn over \$150,000 to be in top five percent)
<b>3%</b>	The percentage of all income taxes currently being paid by the lower half of families (must earn less than \$31,000 to be in lower half)
<b>33%</b>	The percentage of families filing a tax return that had zero or less in income taxes paid (making it mathematically impossible to cut taxes for "95 percent of working families")
<b>0</b>	Number of developed countries that have a higher corporate income tax rate than the United States (we're tied with Japan at 40%)
<b>25%</b>	The average European corporate income tax rate
<b>578,000</b>	Number of Americans attending Tax Day Tea Parties (and counting)
<b>540</b>	Number of Tax Day Tea Parties (and counting)
